The second session of the WSYF will take place on Tuesday, and will consist of two sections:

- 1) Vision, Mission, and Governance, and
- 2) World Scout Conference Overview.

In order to prepare for them we have developed a series of easy steps for participants. A workshop is planned in each topic. The first rounds of workshops (focus on vision & mission) will take place on Tuesday 8 July from 09.15 till 10.15, and second part of workshops (focus on the World Scout Conference) will be from 11.15 till 12.15. Each participant is asked to register to each workshop before the session.

1. **Learn** about the topics that will be discussed through self-learning and active research.

Topics for Vision, Mission and Governance

i. Workshop 1. **Vision: Creating a Better World**

ii. Workshop 2. **Mission: Educating young people to play a constructive role in society**

Questions: 1) Why should young people play a constructive role in society? 2) What is a constructive role in society?

iii. Workshop 3. **Strengths: Involving, Exciting, Empowering**

Questions: 1) Why are these our strengths? 2) How can we bolster our strengths?

iv. Workshop 4. **Communication Themes: A culture of peace, A constructive contribution**

Questions: 1) Why are we a social force? 2) How do we practice a culture of peace? 3) How should we communicate our constructive contributions?

v. Workshop 5. **WOSM Governance: Main Challenges**

Questions: 1) Why is governance important? 2) What are the challenges that WOSM's governance faces?

vi. Workshop 1. **WOSM Governance**

Questions: 1) Why a Governance for WOSM? 2) There are other ways?

vii. Workshop 2. **Educational Methods**

Questions: 1) What does the Educational Methods do? 2) Why is it important for our movement?

viii. Workshop 3. **Strategy**

Questions: 1) Are the strategic priorities measurable?, How? 2) Why are they strategic?

ix. Workshop 4. **Constitution**

Questions: 1) Why is having a constitution important? 2) What are the pros and cons of WOSM's constitution?

x. Workshop 5. **Membership Development**

Questions: 1) What are the main obstacles for developing our membership? 2) What innovations for promoting Scouting do you identify?

xi. Workshop 6. **Image of Scouting**

Questions: 1) Why is it important to have an image policy? 2) How can we promote it within our movement?

xii. Workshop 7. **Challenges for Scouting**

Questions: 1) What are the challenges of Scouting today? 2) How could we overcome them?

2. **Choose a topic** during the forum to work on.

During the forum you will be given an opportunity to sign up for a working group and a workshop on one of the previous topics. Be sure to have previous knowledge in all of them and make a constructive contribution.

3. **Share your point of view** with the rest of the participants.

We recommend you to be prepared to make your contribution by:

- Researching the topics and answering both questions with reasonable arguments.
- Having related examples from your NSO that you can share with the rest of the participants.
- Being able to share your point of view in a concrete and precise way.
