

## **Jeremiah Nyagah's Scout Bio**

Young Jeremiah joined Scouting as soon as he was admitted to the Alliance High School in 1937. He rose from being a Rover Scout to being the longest serving Chief Commissioner and the immediate former Chief Scout of Kenya.

In 1952, Jeremiah went for further studies at the Oxford University, while there, he was vested as a King Scout. In February 1982 he was awarded the **Bronze Wolf**, the highest Scout distinction for outstanding service to international Scouting. At the regional level, Nyagah held the **Elephant** and the **Platinum** awards, the highest in Africa and Kenya respectively. He was considered an icon and father of Scouting in Kenya. His wife, Eunice Wambere, was actively involved in the Girl Guide Movement since childhood.
