# **Ticket to Life Project**

**Focus: Scout Advancement**

**Lee Dassanayake Scout Centre**  
**Mirigama, Sri Lanka**

**5 – 8 October 2010**



## Introduction

The APR Ticket to Life Project is an on-going flagship project of the Asia-Pacific Region, now on its fourth year of operation. The Asia-Pacific Regional Office of the World Scout Bureau monitors this project in the following eight pilot countries – Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

Based on the original project proposal of APR Ticket to Life, an annual evaluation workshop will be organized inviting national coordinators from national Scout organizations that have actively participated and have successfully implemented their country plans during the current year. Since 2007, coordinators and unit leaders have evaluated the project on a yearly basis.

Looking at the past - in India 2007, the workshop shared experiences and dealt on clarifying gray areas about the project. In Nepal 2008, the workshop was focused on and organized to determine the general impact of the project to the community. It was an opportunity to coach national coordinators in filling up report forms. The next annual workshop for 2009 was held in January 2010, which focused on the impact of the project on individuals; while the Ticket to Life Evaluation and Planning Workshop for 2010, was held from 5-8 October 2010 in Sri Lanka, which focused on Scout advancement.



With 12 overseas participants from five countries and another 11 Sri Lankan participants, the workshop was held at the Lee Dassanayake Training Centre in Mirigama, an hour and a half travel from the capital city of Colombo.

## Aim

The workshop's aim was to gather the national coordinators of Ticket to Life project, who have actively participated and successfully implemented their country plans. It also aimed at evaluating the work done during the year particularly with regard to Scout Advancement of Scouts, under the TTL project.

## Workshop Objectives

At the end of the seminar, which lasted four full days, participants were able to:

1. Identify and share what went well, what went wrong and what should be done in improving the Ticket to Life Project;
2. List ways to improve documentation and reporting; monitor the Scout Advancement of Scouts under the TTL project and assess the impact of the project; and
3. Develop a plan for the next year of the Ticket to Life Project.



## Workshop Summary

Member of Parliament for Gampaha District and former Scout Hon. Wasantha Senanayake inaugurated the workshop. He praised the project for involving the most underserved segment of society and added that he himself owes much his values, character and self-confidence through Scouting. He assured that as a Scout, he will do his best to support Scouting in every possible way. Senanayake hails from a very reputable family in Sri Lanka who has held the position of first and third Prime Ministership after the independence of Sri Lanka.

In his opening remarks, Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed said that the basis of the project is to inspire street children to learn, at the same time, to share the values of Scouting. He highlighted the evident changes recorded at the beginning of this year during the evaluation workshop where the impact of Scouting on the lives of these children were measured using a sample size of over 400 children.

Present at the opening were Chief Commissioner Chandrasena Batuwangala, APR Management Sub Committee Chairman Janaprith Fernando and International Commissioner Shiraz Shalih who is the workshop director.

As Scout Advancement was the emphasis of this year's workshop, it was important to see how many Scouts have advanced from one level to the other during his/her stay with the APR Ticket to Life Project. Each national coordinator made a presentation on the present situation of the project in their countries. In the subsequent pages, the advancement situation of Scouts, under the Ticket to Life Project is presented as a whole - Asia-Pacific Region is presented, and then by country.



Furthermore, it was required in 2009 that the national coordinators identify a number of Scouts as a study sample. Each Scout, who is part of this study sample is continuously observed, surveyed and documented. It was also interesting to show how many of these Scouts, from this study sample, have advanced to the next level during his/her stay in the APR Ticket to Life Project.

### Education through Scouting

As we mentioned earlier, the first Evaluation and Planning Workshop in India in 2007, served as an avenue to evaluate concepts and methods taken during the 6-month pilot test period. During this time, the Asia-Pacific Region presented the "ideal picture" of the project and comparing it to what is actually happening in the countries.

A guest input speaker from the Arab Region added color to the workshop. The guest, Dr. Amr Taha, a medical doctor who has extensive experience on child labor and occupational hazards from the International Labor Organization, made a presentation on Scout's role in combating child labor, especially in the streets. He has greatly help especially in designing the report forms.



In Nepal 2008, the workshop was focused on identifying and sharing the coordinator's assessment on the impact of Scouting on the street children; the remarkable changes in their behavior, and how these changes are affecting their families and immediate communities.

The national coordinators were briefed on the "rights of the child" and an input was made on "keeping Scouts safe from harm." As some of the National Coordinators were having difficulties in filling-up the required report forms, a full session was organized on documentation and on how to fill-up the report.

The annual workshop for 2009 was held in January 2010 in Bangladesh, besides evaluating and planning, the specific purpose of the workshop was to identify any measurable impact of the Scouting program on the behaviors of individuals. So for purposes of assessment, 143 children in the eight participating countries were identified for the study as a sample survey and reports were presented at the workshop.

The Ticket to Life Evaluation and Planning Workshop for 2010, was held from 5-8 October 2010 in Sri Lanka, which focused on Scout advancement, which is Scouting's approach to Education – person-centered, community-related, and spiritually oriented.



During their educational tour, the Speaker of the Sri Lanka Parliament Hon. Chamal Rajapakse received the Ticket to Life (TTL) project national coordinators and workshop participants, while the parliament was still in session in the evening of 7th October 2010

Scouting educated young people through the Scout Method, which composed of several different educational tools. One of these educational elements is what is called – personal progression. These are series of progress stages/levels and/or badges that a Scout works on to earn it, based on the effort made by each young person and the progress s/he has made in relation to her/himself. Baden Powell, in his book "Aids to Scoutmastership" puts it perfectly well:

*"Our standard for badge earning is not attainment of a certain level of quality of knowledge or skill, but the amount of effort the boy (or girl) has put into acquiring such knowledge or skill. This brings the most hopeless case on to a footing of equal possibility with his more brilliant or better-off brother (or sister)."*

The table in succeeding pages will show the total number of Scout Troop and the available adult leaders. It also shows the total number of females and males in each country. Since each national Scout organizations have different realities, it was difficult to analyze the Asia-Pacific scenario. However, a number of realizations can be deduced from the data at hand.

It is indicated in the Asia-Pacific table that 53 young people are still not invested as Scouts. This may be those Scouts who can not cope with the requirements for Membership Badge. It was mentioned in the previous workshop reports that since the children do not get the right nutrition from the streets, they are much challenged in memorizing and reciting the Scout Oath and Law, which is one of the basic requirement to be a Scout. However, majority of these 53 young children have just joined at the middle of the programme.

In Bangladesh, there is a significant decrease in membership from 470 in 2009 to 320 in 2010. This decrease is brought about by the re-structuring applied in Scout Troops that allowed only 32 children in one Scout Troop. The general standard in Scouting is 32 children for every Scout Troop. Drop-outs are a common feature in this project but still membership has been increasing in the rest of countries where Ticket to Life is present.

For a healthy Scout Programme to be realized, Scout Leaders should be able to facilitate the advancement of at least 10% of her/his Scouts to the next advancement stage/level. We believe that the adult leaders are doing a great job since the countries advancement percentage is way above the standard of 10%. Though there is a significant decrease in the number of children not invested to Scouting, this is a positive development since this means that more children have been invested to Scouting that year.

The number of Scouts per rank in one year also decreased as the rank moves from one stage/level to a higher one. This is brought about by the principle that when the higher the level is the difficult the task or requirements are. After another year or two, we expect to receive a report from the national coordinators indicating that some Scouts, under Ticket to Life Project have earned the highest stage/level of Scout advancement in their national Scout organizations.

While we expect the national coordinator to continue with the Scout advancement, we are encouraging them to start planning and introducing short-term vocational or livelihood skills training courses to Scouts. This will be the main focus of the 2011 Evaluation and Planning Workshop in the Philippines. The aim of this "theme" is to equip these Scouts with necessary skills that can start with an income-generating livelihood.



### **Post - Workshop Commitment**

Towards the end of the workshop, the 12 overseas participants from five countries and another 11 Sri Lankan participants, developed the following actions points, which they promised and committed to accomplish until the next APR Evaluation and Planning workshop in the Philippines. Here they are:

1. Organize an orientation for all Unit Leaders, who are not present in Sri Lanka Workshop, by the end of December 2010
  - Brief them on the work done in Mirigama;
  - Explain the concept of the project in detail;
  - Coach them how to fill- up the prescribed form
2. For all existing Troops, complete the pending reports, until the third quarter of 2010, as discussed in the bilateral meeting and submit, by the end of October 2010
3. For every existing Troop, complete required form for 2011 and submit by 15 January 2011, as follows:
  - Country Plan, for every troop
  - Budget (for one year) sheet for every Troop
  - Troop Plan (for 48 weeks) for every Troop
4. For all existing Troops, complete any pending reports by the end of December 2010:
  - Parent's/ Guardian's consent
  - Individual Information Form
5. Identify grant making institutions to support the operation of the existing and/or new Scout Troop
