13th World Scout Moot - Kenya 27 July to 7 August 2010

Dear friends,

I am very pleased to inform you that the World Scout Committee received an excellent presentation on a number aspects of the World Scout Moot from Jared Abayo, Deputy KSA. The Committee fully endorsed all the information that was presented. This information can now shared with National Scout Organizations through this circular and will soon be available on a dedicated World Scout Moot web-site.

The Kenya Scout Association has been preparing for this event for some time and there is now a clear structure in place to support this event. This includes a Moot Council, which consists of prominent members of the Kenya Scoute Association governing council and distinguished partners from the corporate world, and the Moot Management and Organising Committees. Personnel have been recruited recently to provide the secretariat to the Moot and a building on Rowallan campsite has been identified as the Moot Headquarters.

The Kenyan Government are fully supporting the Moot and a substantial grant has been provided from the Ministry of Youth and Sport.

The KSA and the members of the World Scout Committee are aware that the information on this event is rather late in being shared with NSOs. We hope that now this key information is available and the logo and fees have been agreed, good progress will be made.

To support the Moot Organisers could you please fill in the attached form to indicate the approximate number of young people, leaders and members of the International Service Team that you expect to attend the Moot from your NSO. Please return this form to the KSA by the end of May 2009.

A Head of Contingent (HOC) meeting is planned from 7-9 September 2009. This timing coincides with the end of the Africa Regional Conference in Botswana. Participants can travel to Nairobi immediately after the Conference. There will be a briefing meeting in Rowallan, visits to one of the three closest expedition centres and then a further meeting in Rowallan before participants depart. More information on the HOC meeting will be available in the near future.

I hope that you will support this important event for the Movement and the first World Scout Youth Event to take place in the Africa Region.

Number and age of participants: 2,500 young people aged 18-25 at the time of the Moot.

Programme Concept:

The Rover Scouts will be organised in International Teams of 10 Scouts from 5 countries. The programme is in two parts; four days in one of the Expedition Centres and then four days all together back at the main camp-site in Nairobi, Rowallan.

The programme is based in four areas, taken from the new Guidelines for the Rover Scout Section: International Co-operation and Understanding, Community service and Community development, Adventure in the wilderness and Leadership development.

The experiences in the five expedition centres will be on common themes but each will be unique as it will build on the resources of the local environment and local communities.

At Rowallan camp-site, participants will have the opportunity to share their experiences and take part in workshops and cultural activities provided by local NGOs and cultural groups. Throughout the event there will be a focus on international friendship, understanding and co-operation.

Home Hospitality: Home hospitality will be available before and after the event. More information will follow.

Contingent Leaders Meeting: 7-9 September, 2009 at Rowallan Scout Campsite.

Visas: There is a commitment from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to facilitate the provision of entry visas to all Rovers and leaders attending the event.

Solidarity Fund: A solidarity fund will be established.
