### Chairman:

- **Professor Biorn Maybury–Lewis**

Executive Director, Harvard University's David Rockefeller Centre for Latin American Studies.

For the past eight years, Prof. Maybury–Lewis has worked in various challenging environments and has led scientific research expeditions in the Brazilian Amazon region.

### Members:

- **Professor Acheampong Yaw Amoateng**

Taught at the Universities of Transkei, North-West and the Western Cape before joining the Human Sciences Research Council five years ago.

He has conducted extensive pure and applied research on several family-related issues in Africa. He has extensive experience in social science research and has a specialty in the formation and dissolution of family models. He has undertaken research in adolescent behaviour, especially in terms of alcohol and drug use.

- **Professor Elio Borgonovi**

Professor of Public Administration Economy and Director of the Department of Public Administration at the Bocconi University in Milan; Chairman of the Research Centre on Health Services Management; Director of the Carlo Masini Institute of Public Administration and Health Care.

Prof. Borgonovi is involved in several international networks. Amongst others, he is a member of the Scientific Committee of CIGAR (Comparative International Governmental Accounting Research), a founding member of EURAM (European Academy of Management), a member of the International Research Symposium on Public Management, a member of the International Public Management Network.

He has a special interest in the social responsibility of private corporations and public administrations, including value-based management.

- **Doctor Evelina Maclang – Vicencio**

Project Leader, Training Tools Development (World Scout Bureau, Asia-Pacific Office) since October 2002.

She has prepared training modules and syllabuses to harmonise leader training in the Region. She is the Chairman of the Metrobank Foundation, Inc. Network of Outstanding Teachers and Educators, an honour society whose 256 members are winners of the Annual Search for Outstanding Teachers of the Philippines.

- **Professor Charles Magnin**

Professor, History of Education at the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences, University of Geneva; Chairman of the Foundation for the Archives of the Jean-Jacques Rousseau Institute.

He is the coordinator of a research project on interdisciplinary training for political dialogue in the field of education (Geneva International Academic Network).

- **Professor Fernando M. Reimers**

Professor of International Education at the Ford Foundation and Director of Global Education and International Education Policy at Harvard University.

He lectures on the relationship between educational policy and instructional improvement in developing countries. His current research focuses on the impact of educational policies on literacy instruction. He has just completed an evaluation study of a national programme that aimed to promote literacy instruction in Mexico as part of a broad evaluation of the main educational policies of the Mexican federal government.

- **Professor Cesare Scurati**

Director of the Department of Pedagogy at the Catholic University of Milan. He lectures on General Pedagogy at the Faculty of Psychology and is the author of a number of books and articles on the subject. He is the director of several scientific magazines, including "Dirigenti Scuola" and "Scuola Materna".

He has served as Vice-Chairman of the National Commission for New Orientations for Infant Schools (1988-1991) and as Chairman of the Italian Society of Pedagogy (1997-2000).

- **Professor Allen Warren**

Head of the History Department, University of York, and Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.

He is the author of academic and scholarly writing on the history of youth movements in the U.K., including Scouting and Guiding; and of publications on Anglo-Irish history in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.
