Call for participation to the World Scout Parliamentary Union (WSPU) General Assembly

Dear colleagues,

The 6th General Assembly of the World Scout Parliamentary Union (WSPU) will take place from 1-4 November 2010, in Seoul, South Korea. You will find attached a copy of the invitation which has been sent to the National Scout Parliamentary Associations of WOSM's member countries on behalf of the WSPU Office in Seoul.

All NSOs which have not already done so are asked to contact their respective Scout Parliamentarians without delay, in order to take the necessary steps to ensure that their country will be represented at the meeting. Although it is not a statutory meeting of WOSM, this event is nevertheless very important for the Movement.

In line with World Scout Conference Resolutions No. 7/05 and 28/08, and the need for an increased international recognition of World Scouting, the WSPU General Assembly represents an extraordinary opportunity to promote the development of policies related to youth involvement and volunteering.

Parliamentarians participating in the WSPU General Assembly will have the chance to debate the proposed themes, and to present positive and negative examples of Scout-related legislation. It is evident that this will require the involvement and support of NSOs, who are in the best position to identify the limitations to Scouting, based on current laws, as well as the advantage that may develop from specific legislative or regulatory provisions in support of the development of Scouting.

Passport and Visa

All visitors to Korea must have a valid passport and visa. Visitors with roundtrip tickets from countries that have a special agreement with Korea may be exempt from the visa requirement and can stay in Korea visa-free for periods from 30 to 90 days, depending on the type of agreement between the two countries.
